**Growing equality** between men and women is undoubtedly positive, but the rapid pace of change had caused some alarm. Does this reflect a certain nostalgia for our patriarchal past or a resistance to accept uniform gender relations?

How can we learn to live together and enjoy the benefits of our differences, without feeling that our identities are challenged? How can we move towards equality between men and women, while also respecting these differences?

This three-day session will explore today's "new deal" in male/female relations.

It will leverage inputs from stakeholders and researchers in various domains: sociology, philosophy, psychoanalysis, anthropology, theology, history, etc.
